Request that the City perform compliance inspection as ordered by Council File No. 18-0203 passed by the Los Angeles City Council on 9/7/2018 – DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION

* **ENV-2019-4121-ND (Multiple Locations – Arlington Heights, Angelus Vista, Jefferson Park)**

Project: Resolution and code amendment related to the transfer of land use authority from the Community Redevelopment Agency of the City of Los Angeles, Designated Local Authority (CRA/LA-DLA) to the City of Los Angeles; and code amendment to establish procedures for the implementation of unexpired redevelopment plans and update other relevant code provisions in the Los Angeles Municipal Code to facilitate the transfer of land use authority from the CRA/LA-DLA to the City of Los Angeles. Review of proposed “Negative Declaration” that there will not be an “impact” as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act.

The Mid-City Recovery Redevelopment Project Area falls partially within UNNC boundaries.

Of potential interest to UNNC stakeholders, the Planning Department’s Office of Historic Resources has been allocated one additional staff position expressly for the purpose of supplementing its capacity to conduct reviews of “presumptive historical resources” within all Redevelopment Project Areas. However, it is not clear from current documents presented how this will be done for the Mid-City Recovery Area as CRA did not conduct an original survey and to-date has analyzed resources/projects individually.
