A. **Presentation, Sugar Hill Arts Revival Project:** Through the shared vision of the Amazing Grace Conservatory (AGC), The Gailen and Cathy Reeves Center (GCRC) and the USC School of Dramatic Arts, the Sugar Hill Arts Revival Project (SHARP) Initiative was created. The SHARP initiative, funded through the California Arts Council, will help revitalize and re-imagine the Sugar Hill Arts District not only as a historic preservation site and landmark destination of African-American history, arts, activism, civic engagement, leadership, and strategic vision—but also as a catalyst site for community building, urban renewal, and change which sustains intergenerational urban communities. The SHARP team will share information about the project launch on Juneteenth (for the Virtual Living museum) and AGC’s Open House on June 20 promoting Summer classes for youth and adults, upcoming community engagement activities, and opportunities for UNNC and its stakeholders to get involved. – DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION

B. **Neighborhood Purpose Grant (NPG) Funding Request:** The Strider Education Foundation requests an NPG grant to help support the funding needed for a 50-school **All Kids Bike (AKB) Kindergarten PE Learn-To-Ride Pilot Program** within the Los Angeles Unified School District, in partnership with the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) Office of Wellness Programs. The All Kids Bike Kindergarten PE Program will equip schools with everything needed to get their kindergartners rolling, including a fleet of 2-in-1 balance-to-pedal conversion bikes, kickstands, helmets, an integrative 8-lesson curriculum, teacher training, and a 5-year support plan. Total cost is projected at \$200,000 (\$4,000 per school). Applicant proposes that one of the 50 schools will be a school located within UNNC’s footprint. Request \$4,000.00. – **DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION**

## **Telecommunication Relay Services**

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territories for local and/or long distance calls. TRS providers - generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user. What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TTY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service.

Don't hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the CA is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service ..." when you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.



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Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. If you have limitations hearing or speaking a specially-trained Communications Assistant (CA) can relay telephone conversations for all of your calls. In California, dial 711 to reach the California Relay Service (CRS). If you prefer having your calls immediately answered in your mode of communication, dial one of the toll-free modality- and language-specific numbers below. The call will be routed to the CRS provider.

No part of the conversation that takes place between callers is revealed or recorded in written, verbal, or any other form. CRS CAs do not participate in the conversation and acquire no benefit from information relayed.
