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**AGENDA**

**1). Determination to continue to hold meetings virtually:** *The Board of Neighborhood Commissioners (BONC) and the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment, with guidance from the Los Angeles City Attorney, have established that BONC has the authority to adopt AB 361 Findings Pursuant to Government Code Section 54953(E)(1)(b)-(c) on behalf of the City’s neighborhood councils, and to determine that due to the Covid-19 state of emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees. This meeting is being conducted virtually pursuant to that directive.*

**2). Welcome & Call to Order; Review of UNNC Standing Rules for Committee Stakeholder Voting Participation; Introductions and Voting Affirmations; Review of the Agenda**

Presentation by the American Institute of Architects, Los Angeles Chapter (AIALA) –** Presentation by AIALA representatives about their mission, their new headquarters that is opening this year on Adams at Victoria (just west of the UNNC area), and their objectives to engage the community in the coming years. – **DISCUSSION**

**5). UNNC Returns to In-Person Meetings in March:** The City’s neighborhood councils return to in-person meetings, and/or hybrid in-person + Zoom meetings, starting March 1, 2023, a move required due to the end of the declared COVID emergency. UNNC is opting for a hybrid model. Possible legislative action at the state level is pending to allow for some governmental bodies to remain virtual, including NCs. Learn more at this meeting. – **DISCUSSION**

**6). Follow-up to Previous Cases, ENS, and Old Business. – DISCUSSION AND ACTION**

– **UPDATE 1848 S. Gramercy Pl., CPC-2020-2115-DB-HCA** Review of new plans that are slightly modified from previous plans and recently submitted to the Planning Department from the developer. Possible actions could be to modify the current UNNC position taken on the project in a Resolution and CIS in March, 2022, reaffirm the position, or take no action. Any of the above could be used to state the UNNC position at an upcoming City Planning Commission, hearing date tentatively set for February 23, 2023. – **DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION**

– **UPDATE Re Activity on Oil Drilling Sites, Case #ZA-2022-8997-ZAI-1A** Update on a recent City case on oil drilling activity and the definition of “well maintenance.” – **DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION**



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**– UPDATE Post-Hearing to Proposed Transition to a Permanent Al Fresco and Possible Reconsideration:** The Planning Department held a public hearing on February 8, at which many restaurant owners and industry professionals testified that the new regulations would be cost-prohibitive, particularly for those restaurants presently serving alcohol in an outdoor setting. The stated purpose of the original temporary Al Fresco Dining program and the proposed Permanent program is to support the City’s restaurants. UNNC’s Governing Board previously took a position generally supportive of the proposed ordinance, with concern about the various departments working together. A stakeholder has requested that UNNC reconsider and review the provisions that may cause financial issues for restaurant owners. [*The proposed Permanent Al Fresco Ordinance would amend Sections 12.03, 12.10.5, 12.11.5, 12.12.2, 12.13, 12.14, 12.21, 12.21.1, and 12.24 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) to clarify and streamline Zoning Code regulations regarding outdoor dining on private property. As proposed, outdoor dining that complies with the applicable standards would be permitted as a by-right use in any zones where restaurants are currently permitted. Any outdoor alcohol service would continue to require compliance with all applicable zoning regulations.*] Discuss proposing an updated UNNC Community Impact Statement (CIS) based on the hearing testimony. – **DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION**

**NOTE:** UNNC's action on land use items may include support, support if project is amended to include UNNC-recommended conditions, or opposition; and UNNC may write a letter, adopt a resolution and/or adopt a Community Impact Statement (CIS) regarding both proposed projects and citywide planning initiatives.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board’s or Committee’s jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board or Committee is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board or Committee meeting. Public comment is limited to 1 minute per speaker, unless waived by the presiding officer of the Board or Committee. At this virtual meeting, when prompted by the presiding chair to provide public input, members of the public will be requested to dial \*9 or use the Raise Hand option on the computer, to address any agenda item before the Committee takes an action on an item.



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**Further AB 361 Updates:** Public comment cannot be required to be submitted in advance of the meeting, only real-time public comment is required. If there are any broadcasting interruptions that prevent the public from observing or hearing the meeting, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned. If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.

**Please note:** All UNNC stakeholders are invited to participate in UNNC Standing Committee meetings. UNNC's Governing Board appoints Committee Chairs and Co-Chairs annually; these positions are open to all stakeholders. Per UNNC practice and policy, all stakeholders present at a Standing Committee meeting, including members of UNNC's Governing Board, are considered to be members of that committee for the duration of that meeting, and may equally participate, including by making motions and voting. Any action taken at the meeting is only a recommendation to the Governing Board; no Standing Committee may act on behalf of the Governing Board without prior authorization. UNNC's Governing Board members may be in attendance at its Standing Committee meetings as participants or observers. Per the California Open Meetings Act ("The Ralph M. Brown Act"), in accordance with Government Code Chapter 9 / meetings [54950 - 54963], Section 54952 (b), UNNC's Standing Committees are "legislative bodies" for the purposes of this Chapter. And, in accordance with Section 54952.2. (c) (6), nothing in this section prevents the attendance of a majority of the members of a legislative body at an open and noticed meeting of a standing committee of that body.

### Telecommunication Relay Services

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territories for local and/or long distance calls. TRS providers – generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user. What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TIY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service.

Don't hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the Communications Assistant (CA) is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service . . ." when you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.

If you have limitations hearing or speaking a specially-trained CA can relay telephone conversations for all of your calls. In California, dial 711 to reach the California Relay Service (CRS). If you prefer having your calls immediately answered in your mode of communication, dial one of the toll-free modality- and language-specific numbers below. The call will be routed to the CRS provider.

No part of the conversation that takes place between callers is revealed or recorded in written, verbal, or any other form. CRS CAs do not participate in the conversation and acquire no benefit from information relayed.
