1). Welcome & Call to Order; Review of UNNC Standing Rules for Committee Stakeholder Voting Participation; Introductions and Voting Affirmations; Review of the Agenda

2). General Public Comments (1-2 minutes per speaker)

3). Finalize Recommended Community Impact Statements (CIS) RE: Two ED-1 Motions relative to RSO Housing and Historic HPOZ zones: The Mayor's Executive Directive 1 ("ED1") has been used to permit more than 14,000 new units of affordable housing, taking advantage of streamlining provisions which allow developers to avoid many of the city's discretionary review processes. However, two new City Council motions aim to renters currently living in RSO properties, as well as historic neighborhoods. The UNNC Planning & Zoning Committee reviewed the motions at its May 15, 2024 meeting and is now preparing CIS statements to refer to the UNNC Governing Board.

A. Council District 1 Councilmember Eunisses Hernandez proposed the adoption of an interim control ordinance, Council File No. 24-0457, which would create a new discretionary approval process for developments on sites currently improved with rent stabilized apartments, or were vacated via the Ellis Act within the past five years. (Motion and draft CIS will be in agenda packet). -- **DISCUSSION AND ACTION**

B. Council District 5 Councilmember Katie Yaroslavsky proposed the creation of a citywide interim control ordinance, Council File No. 24-0490, which would restore the Historic Preservation Overlay Zone (HPOZ) review process for any permits required for 100 percent affordable housing projects within their boundaries. Seconded by Council District 10 Councilmember Heather Hutt. (Motion and draft CIS will be in agenda packet). – **DISCUSSION AND ACTION**

4). Initial Review of Case No. CPC-2024-3112-DB-PR-VHCA, 2800 West Jefferson Blvd., Proposed Mixed Use Development: Demolition of existing auto body/commercial and construction of new 70,852-sq-ft, 6-story, 70-foot Commercial and Multifamily building with 70 units (9 very low income) and a 2,000-sq-ft commercial space in the C2-1VL-CPIO. Requesting on and off-menu density incentives and waivers of development standards, including parking reduction to 1/2 space per unit; 20% open space reduction; FAR of 3.33 in lieu of 1.5; rear yard reduction of 73% to permit 5 feet in lieu of 18 feet; changes to the transitional height requirements to start at 31 feet in lieu of 15 feet; and permitting 6 stories in lieu of 3 stories required in the zone. Applicant Representative(s) may not be present at this meeting; only an initial review of plans is scheduled. – **DISCUSSION ITEM**

Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's or Committee's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board or Committee is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board or Committee meeting. Public comment is limited to 1 minute per speaker, unless waived by the presiding officer of the Board or Committee. At this meeting, when prompted by the presiding chair to provide public input, members of the public who are attending virtually will be requested to dial *9 or use the Raise Hand option on the computer, to address any agenda item before the Committee takes an action on an item.

Further Brown Act Updates: Public comment cannot be required to be submitted in advance of the meeting, only real-time public comment is required. If there are any broadcasting interruptions that prevent the public from observing or hearing the meeting, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned. If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.

Please note: All UNNC stakeholders are invited to participate in UNNC Standing Committee meetings. UNNC's Governing Board appoints Committee Chairs and Co-Chairs annually; these positions are open to all stakeholders. Per UNNC practice and policy, all stakeholders present at a Standing Committee meeting, including members of UNNC's Governing Board, are considered to be members of that committee for the duration of that meeting, and may equally participate, including by making motions and voting. Any action taken at the meeting is only a recommendation to the Governing Board; no Standing Committee may act on behalf of the Governing Board without prior authorization. UNNC's Governing Board members may be in attendance at its Standing Committee meetings as participants or observers. Per the California Open Meetings Act ("The Ralph M. Brown Act"), in accordance with Government Code Chapter 9 / meetings [54950 - 54963], Section 54952 (b), UNNC's Standing Committees are "legislative bodies" for the purposes of this Chapter. And, in accordance with Section 54952.2. (c) (6), nothing in this section prevents the attendance of a majority of the members of a legislative body at an open and noticed meeting of a standing committee of that body.

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Telecommunication Relay Services: Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications. Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territories for local and/or long distance calls. TRS providers – generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user.

What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TTY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service. Don't hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the Communications Assistant (CA) is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service . . ." when you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.

If you have limitations hearing or speaking a specially-trained CA can relay telephone conversations for all of your calls. In California, dial 711 to reach the California Relay Service (CRS). If you prefer having your calls immediately answered in your mode of communication, dial one of the toll-free modality- and language-specific numbers below. The call will be routed to the CRS provider.

No part of the conversation that takes place between callers is revealed or recorded in written, verbal, or any other form. CRS CAs do not participate in the conversation and acquire no benefit from information relayed.
