2126 West Adams Boulevard, Applicant Freeport McMoRan Oil & Gas (FMOG)

Proposed installation of new oil/gas production equipment (a CEB Clean Emissions Burner to burn waste gas) and Sound Wall at the existing oil production facility located on the south side of Adams Boulevard at Gramercy Place, to 27th Street in Jefferson Park. As submitted, the application calls for placement of the new CEB and the Sound Wall into the lower, landscaped portion of the large parcel nearer to 27th Street, rather than within the active drilling operations that is currently surrounded by a perimeter wall on the upper terrace at West Adams Boulevard. Applicant also proposes an exemption from environmental review. Additional production equipment may be proposed for changes. – DISCUSSION AND ACTION | |
