*** Case No. CPC-2016-1906-CA, CEQA No. ENV-2016-1907-CE – Proposed Amendments to the Citywide HPOZ Ordinance**

The Department of City Planning is proposing changes/amendments to the Historic Preservation Overlay Zone (HPOZ) Ordinance. The current HPOZ Ordinance, as contained in Section 12.20.3 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC), includes procedures for the establishment of an HPOZ, adoption of a Preservation Plan, and the review of projects. According to the Office of Historic Resources, "with thirty current HPOZs and seven new HPOZs expected to be adopted from 2016-2017, the procedures and process thresholds within the ordinance need to be reviewed, clarified, and improved to provide more efficient implementation." Comments are due by August 11, 2016. At this meeting, stakeholders are invited to share their ideas and/or concerns with UNNC so that UNNC may develop its own comment letter. – DISCUSSION AND ACTION.
